1.0 BACKGROUND

Los Angeles County is the largest and most complex election jurisdiction in the nation. The Registrar-Recorder/County Clerk (RR/CC) is responsible for registering voters, maintaining voter files and conducting federal, state, local, and special elections. There are 5,253,855 registered voters within Los Angeles County and approximately 5,000 voting locations (also referred to as precinct polling places). Forty percent of registered voters in Los Angeles County are Permanent Vote by Mail (VBM) voters, with the remaining voters anticipated to vote at the polls on Election Day. A. Voting Systems Assessment Project (VSAP) Overview

Launched in September 2009, the Voting Systems Assessment Project (VSAP) was developed in response to the growing voting system needs and challenges faced by the County. VSAP is a five-phase plan to modernize the County's voting experience through a voter-centered approach.

Testimony before the United States Presidential Commission on Election Administration

"Plagued by a stalled voting systems market and an aging voting system, in 2009, we launched a voting systems project that set out to transform the market as we know it by implementing a process that seeks to redesign the voting experience in Los Angeles County through voter input and stakeholder participation and envisions the development and implementation of open voting systems that elicit public trust and encourage greater participation.

...We should be guided by the dynamics of the voting public we serve – seniors whose needs include accessibility and readability of materials; persons with disabilities who have a reasonable expectation of fair and respectful service that allows for a private and secure voting experience; busy professionals who seek options for voting that match their mobile lifestyles – before and on Election Day; citizens with an array of cultural and ethnic backgrounds who depend on increased language accessibility and voter assistance; and future voters whose expectations may include things not yet considered."

In 2013, the RR/CC identified and engaged IDEO, a global design and innovation firm (specializing in human-centered design) to analyze data and concepts gathered by the RR/CC since project kick-off and to begin to translate that information into refined designs. This work produced design and engineering specifications for a new voting experience which consisting of a new custom-designed Ballot Marking Device (BMD), an improved Vote by Mail (VBM) ballot design, an innovative Interactive Sample Ballot

(ISB), and a modern scalable Tally System. Each of these components is the product of a human-centered design process which included extensive research, stakeholder engagement, iterative prototyping, and consultation with the VSAP Advisory Committee and VSAP Technical Advisory Committee. Together these components will provide voters with an improved and contemporary voting experience that is more accessible, reliable, secure, and transparent.

Phases I-III have been completed. The RR/CC is currently in Phase IV: Manufacturing and Certification. Phase IV includes the development of an implementation plan including the selection of vendor(s) that will assist with the manufacturing, testing, certification and implementation of new voting equipment technologies. These new technologies will be required to go through the State of California Secretary of State (CA SOS) testing and certification process, adhering to California Elections Code, Section 19000 et seq. (“Elections Code”) as amended by Senate Bill (SB) 360, Certification of Voting Systems.

Implementation of the new voting experience developed through the VSAP will begin with a pilot implementation in June 2018. The full implementation of all VSAP elements throughout Los Angeles County will occur in June 2020. For more information about VSAP, visit <http://vsap.lavote.net/>.

The information gathered through this RFI will be used by the RR/CC as it continues to plan for manufacturing and implementation.

Component B	Vote by Mail Ballots
Component C	Vote by Mail Packet Materials
Component D	Vote by Mail Outbound Services

5.0 CURRENT PROCESS FOR EACH COMPONENT (A, B, C AND D)

A. Current Vote at Polls Ballot Process (Component A)

The RR/CC currently uses pre-punch printed cardstock tab cards (IBM 312 Hollerith) as ballots. Specified quantities of ballots are assigned to specific polling places for all Vote at Polls (VAP) voters in the County of Los Angeles based on the voter registration database. Each ballot has a unique counter number stub, a printed precinct number, with a pre-punched group and party identifier on the bottom.

The tally system is tested for each possible combination of votes using pre-punch printed cardstock tab cards, these test ballots are cut from the same paper stock as the precinct ballots.

B. Current Vote by Mail Ballot Process (Component B)

Like the ballot used in the polling place, the County's current Vote By Mail (VBM) ballot is also an IBM 312 Hollerith card that is manually marked by the voter using a typical blue or black ink pen. Each VBM ballot has a removable unique counter number stub, a printed ballot group number and party in a Presidential Primary Election, with a pre-punched ballot group identifier on the bottom.

VBM Ballots, differentiated by Election type in a Presidential Primary Election ballot group numbers and party are printed along the short edge of the ballot. In all other Election types only ballot groups numbers are printed along the short edge of the ballot. The RR/CC orders ballots in varying quantities to meet the size of each group's registered voter population and projected turnout in Los Angeles County. The number of ballot groups varies from election to election and can at times exceed 600 unique groups.

C. Current Vote by Mail Packet Materials Process (Component C)

The current outgoing VBM packet that VBM Voters receive include: (1) an outgoing window envelope; (2) a pre-addressed return envelope; (3) a privacy sleeve; (4) a VBM ballot; (5) an instruction or sample ballot booklet; (6) an "I Voted" sticker; and (7) additional inserts that may be required for a specific election.

For each individual election, the County works with multiple vendors in the development of an election-specific plan that will include varying quantity, design and multi-lingual translation requirements of the requisite VBM materials, as well as a delivery schedule. Contracted vendors are responsible for the manufacture and timely shipment of the VBM materials according to the pre-determined deliverables of the election plan.

Generic VBM material (i.e. outgoing window envelope, pre-addressed return envelope, privacy sleeve, and "I Voted" sticker) is delivered 60-120 days prior to

Election Day and can be ordered once samples are approved by the Registrar. Ballots that are manually marked by the voter are not ordered until candidates and consolidations are finalized for specific precincts and/or ballot group, and party, as required to be printed on the ballot. Instruction or sample ballot booklets, in English and six additional translated languages (for example, Spanish, Chinese, Korean, Tagalog, Vietnamese, and Japanese), contain information about candidates and contests are not finalized until approved by both the Registrar and various external government authorities.

Dependent on several factors, including the unpredictability of judicial rulings, the delivery window for initial quantities of instruction or sample ballot booklets, including the translated versions can be as short as 3-5 days. All VBM materials are expected to be delivered to the RR/CC no later than 60 days before an Election for inserting and mailing to voters.

D. Current Vote by Mail Outbound Services Process (Component D)

The preparation of up to 2.5 million individually addressed VBM packets per election for permanent and one time VBM voter, is performed by a primary contracted vendor at the RR/CC's Norwalk headquarters. Sorting and mailing services for prepared packets for the initial 2.2 million permanent VBM voters are performed by a vendor subcontracted by the primary vendor. Due to limitations both vendors are unable to perform the preparation and mailing of military, overseas, multilingual, and declared VBM packets; the RR/CC is required to perform a separate operation for those specific voters.

Contracted work begins approximately 78 days before Election Day (E-78) with the inkjet printing of voter's information on pre-addressed return envelopes sourced from the current Permanent VBM database (2.2 million voters). From E-29 to E-7, inkjet printing continues on a daily basis in response to new/replacement VBM requests within 24 hours of their approved application.

Inkjet pre-addressed return envelopes are then machine inserted with other ballot-specific and generic election material (up to six individual units) into an outgoing window envelope. Ten through twenty percent of VBM packets are also manually assembled and sealed on the premises. A contractor provides staff to operate Department owned inserter machines to complete assembly and sealing of packets.

Completed VBM packets for the Permanent VBM voters are transported daily as early as E-50, but no later than E-32 to a secure facility to be pre-sorted by zip code for 3rd class mailing by E-29. In preparation for the E-29 mailing, mail verification services are performed with local USPS representatives at the secure sorting facility. Once mail verification is approved, RR/CC staff escort the delivery of permanent VBM packets to designated USPS facilities on E-29. All subsequently assembled VBM packets are processed at the RR/CC and mailed 1st class by the RR/CC staff.

6.0 GOALS FOR EACH COMPONENT AS A RESULT OF VSAP (A, B, C AND D)

A. Goals of Component A - Thermal Ballot Solution (Vote at Polls) As a Result of VSAP

The overall goal of the VSAP is to: (1) replace the InkaVote Vote at Polls (VAP) ballots with thermal paper ballots; (2) enable voters to have a human-readable text representation of their selections on one page; (3) enable voters to cast their ballot at any voting location in Los Angeles County; and (4) expedite the voting process for voters at the polls.

The RR/CC is seeking to manufacture and implement a new Ballot Marking Device (BMD) with new redesigned thermal paper ballots to replace the InkaVote system consisting of Vote Recorder Devices, Precinct Ballot Readers and cardstock tab cards IBM 312 Hollerith ballots. We seek information on planned Thermal Paper Ballot Solutions for adaption of future operating environments as a result of the VSAP. Ideally the Thermal Paper Ballot Solution will incorporate as many of the VSAP Principles (Attachment A) as technically possible.

In addition, the Thermal Paper Ballot solution must meet all of the currently identified twelve conditions:

1. Have a 45 degree angle die-cut on the right corner prior to delivery;
2. Be tinted with the color insignia on the front with a different insignia on the back. The large State Seal is on the back and the Bear insignia is on the front. Both insignias are to be printed on the paper;
3. Be high Sensitivity, 65-110gsm paper weight, 143 µm thick Thermal Paper;
4. Printed on the same paper stock. Use of more than one paper stock per election is not permitted, as in accordance with Election Code 13202;
5. Be able to directly ink-jet on the back of the ballot;
6. Have a protective coating on the thermal front side of ballot paper to ensure longevity in storage. The coating should be not be produced using toxic chemicals such as bisphenol A (BPAs), perflourinated compounds (PFCs) or other carcinogenic chemicals;
7. Able to be stored for up to 22 months following the election, with no degradation in the quality of what is printed on the ballot, in accordance with Election Code §17301;
8. Able to be thermal printed by a compact desktop thermal printer at a vote center by a pollworker;

9. Be packaged in easily trackable quantities of 50 sheets per package with a unique barcode for each package so that pollworkers may set-up, use and monitor in keeping with VSAP Principle 9 (Ease of use);
10. Have full order delivery capability within 60 days or less from the date of placing initial order;
11. Meet California Election Code regulations; and
12. Be printed by a California Secretary of State approved ballot printing facility.

If any of these requirements cannot be met, please provide proposed alternatives or reason why in Section 7.0 Submission Requirements where applicable.

B. Goals of Component B - Vote by Mail Ballot As a Result of VSAP

The overall goal is to (1) replace our current VBM ballots with a full-face, mark-sense ballot; (2) provide voters with a more usable and improved VBM experience; and (3) enable voters to vote on a ballot in the language of their choice.

The RR/CC is seeking to implement this new VBM Ballot for the 2018 Gubernatorial Primary Election. We seek information regarding solutions for producing upwards of 2.5 million certified ballots under the strict production timelines required for conducting an election. Ballots will be produced according to the attached specifications and designs (Attachment C).

In addition, the VBM ballot solution must meet all of the following currently identified twelve conditions:

1. Printed on durable paper or card stock capable of being folded for both outbound and return mailing;
2. Able to be printed in two sizes:
 - a. 8" x 11" small ballot
 - i. Can be mailed in a smaller envelope
 - ii. Requires less storage footprint when flat and folded
 - iii. Can be tallied more quickly
 - b. 10.5" x 17" large ballot
 - i. Reduces number of pages for an election with longer ballot
 - ii. Can still be tallied by standard scanners;
3. Must allow for printing of multi-sheet ballots;
4. Must allow voter to write on the ballot using a standard blue or black pen for the purposes of write-in votes;
5. Printed with precinct and ballot group information in human-readable and machine-readable (QR Code) format on the bottom of each page of the ballot;
6. Ballot must be printed in color with the appropriate colors for instructions and required seals. See attachment B;
7. A solution must exist for creating new and replacement VBM ballot requests between E-29 and E-7 processing a new/replacement VBM request by the next business day;

8. Able to be directly ink-jet election information, including ballot ID, precinct/serial number, instructions, candidate(s), and measure(s) on both sides of the ballot;
9. Able to be stored for up to 22 months following the election, with no degradation in the quality of what is printed on the ballot, in accordance with Election Code §17301;
10. Produced in compliance with all applicable California elections code requirements;
11. All redesigned VBM ballots must meet California Election Code regulations; and
12. All redesigned VBM ballots must be printed by a California Secretary of State approved ballot printing facility.

If any of these requirements cannot be met, please provide proposed alternatives or reason why in Section 7.0 Submission Requirements where applicable.

C. Goals of Component C - Vote by Mail Packet Materials As a Result of VSAP

The overall goal is to replace our current VBM packet materials. The new VBM packet materials include: (1) outbound mailing envelope; (2) voter specific pre-addressed return envelope; (3) instructions; (4) privacy sleeve; (5) "I Voted" sticker; (6) additional inserts that may be required for a specific election; and (7) Redesigned VBM Ballot described separately in component B. Although the redesigned VBM ballot is part of the VBM packet, for the purpose of this RFI it is discussed separately in greater detail in component B.

The RR/CC is seeking to implement this new VBM system for the June 2018 Gubernatorial Primary Election. We seek information regarding solutions for producing current Permanent VBM 2.2 million and upwards of 2.5 million sets of VBM packet materials. Materials will need to be produced and delivered under the strict production timelines required for conducting an Election. VBM packet materials will be produced according to the attached specifications and designs (Attachment C).

In addition, the VBM ballot packets must meet all of the following conditions, including the folded VBM ballot (potentially multiple sheets per ballot) and two sizes: 8" x 11" (small ballot) and 10.5" x 17" (large ballot) conditions:

1. Outbound envelope must be able to accommodate VBM materials.
2. Voter specific pre-addressed return envelope must include generic information such as election information, signature section, VBM oath, and instructions. Prior to mailing, it will need to also include the necessary voter specific information which includes name, machine readable voter identification, and address.
3. Privacy sleeve must accommodate both ballot sizes and will include election information, voting instructions, and additional information.
4. The “I Voted” sticker must be included in the packet either affixed to another component or as a separate item.
5. All materials, including ballots, must be able to be inserted into outbound envelope using standard automated insertion machines.
6. All materials must be produced in compliance with all applicable election code requirements and mailing standards required by the USPS.

If any of these requirements cannot be met, please provide proposed alternatives or reason why in Section 7.0 Submission Requirements where applicable.

D. Goals of Component D - Vote by Mail Outbound Services As a Result of VSAP

The overall goal is to identify new business solutions for our VBM outbound services. These services consist of a mass mailing of VBM packets to the permanent VBM list of 2.2 million and upwards of 2.5 million voters, one-time VBM requests and military and overseas voters.

The RR/CC is seeking to implement this new VBM system for the June 2018 Gubernatorial Primary Election. We seek information regarding solutions for the following processes: 1) printing of voter specific information on VBM envelopes; 2) assembling VBM packets; 3) sorting of VBM packets by zip code; and 4) delivering sorted ballots to USPS for mailing by E-29.

The Vote by Mail Outbound services will need to be completed under the strict timelines required for conducting an election.

In addition, the VBM outbound services must meet all of the currently identified seven conditions:

1. Voter return envelope must include necessary voter specific information which includes name, machine-readable voter identification, serial/precinct number, and address. This printing may be done on generic envelopes;

2. Assembled VBM packets must include the voter specific return envelope and appropriate ballot for the voter based on precinct, language and political party (when necessary). In addition, the packet will include generic materials such as the privacy sleeve and “I Voted” sticker;
3. All VBM packets from the mass file of permanent VBM (2.2 million voters) are to be completed and put into mail circulation beginning E-29;
4. Between E-29 and E-7, one-time VBM application requests and replacement VBM requests are expected to be processed and mailed within one business day of the RR/CC receiving the request from the voter;
5. Outbound services must support the preparation and mailing of VBM packets with precinct-specific ballots;
6. VBM packets need to be staged for mailing in a way that maintains or reduces current mailing costs for the mass mailing. This includes controlling packet weight and sorting by zip code for 3rd class mailing; and
7. All ballots must be mailed and delivered to voters in compliance with all required election code requirements.

A. Submission Requirements for Thermal Ballot Paper (Vote at Polls) (Component A)

We seek information on planned Vote at Polls Thermal Ballot Paper Solutions for adaption of future operating environments as a result of the VSAP.

The Response for Component A Thermal Ballot Paper (Vote at Polls) shall be organized as follows:

- **Cover Page (Component A)**

The Cover Page should include the title and number of the RFI, name and address of the Respondent(s) and the date of the Response.

- **Table of Contents (Component A)**

The Response must contain a Table of Contents with page numbers corresponding to the sections and pages of the Response, including any exhibits, appendices and attachments.

- **Section 1 – Respondent Identifying Information (Component A)**

Use the provided Response Template to complete the requested information. This Section shall include the general profile of the Respondent including the Company name and address, the Respondent's primary point of contact and respective contact information, and the type of business entity (e.g., corporation, partnership, etc.).

 6. Description of characteristics, printer heat temperatures required, all environmental characteristics necessary to store the Thermal Paper Ballot for 24 months. This pertains to both pre (2 months) and post (22 month retention period).
 7. Any trademarked or proprietary product features should include a short explanation of how this feature is used in a typical election and how the trademarked feature could be used in the Los Angeles County operating environment.
 8. Product support and maintenance information, including safety precautions and product data sheets.

If enough interest is generated, the County may consider releasing a formally advertised solicitation, or take no further action. Timely respondents will be placed on a list of interested firms, organizations, and government agencies. Such respondents will be notified of the County's intent to issue a formally advertised solicitation and where to obtain that information.

Cost of RFI Response Preparation

The County shall not in any way be liable or responsible for any and all costs incurred in responding to this RFI.

Disclosure of Contents of RFI Response

Respondents are admonished that all information received in response to this RFI shall become the exclusive property of the County of Los Angeles, shall become a matter of public record, and shall be disclosed to the extent required by law, including, but not limited to, the California Public Records Act (California Government Code Section 6250, et seq.).

Respondents are advised to clearly, unambiguously and specifically identify all aspects of their response to this RFI, which are secret, confidential or proprietary by labeling such confidential material with the appropriate label: "trade secret," "confidential," "proprietary," etc. The County shall not in any way be liable or responsible for the disclosure of any such records or any portion thereof if: 1) any response is not clearly, unambiguously and specifically identified in the aforementioned manner; or 2) if the disclosure is required by law whether or not the documents are clearly marked.

Gratuities Not Permitted

Respondents have not offered or given, and shall not offer or give, to any employee, agent or representative of the County of Los Angeles any gratuity or inducement with a view toward securing any business from the County or any part thereof or influencing such person with respect to terms, conditions, or performance of any business dealing with or from the County or any part thereof.

9.0 GLOSSARY OF TERMS

Ballot Activation Mechanism (BAM): In the VSAP design, a thermal printer will be attached to an electronic poll book to enable printing of a QR Code that will activate the appropriate ballot style on the BMD when the ballot is inserted. This QR Code printed on a generic ballot by the electronic poll book is called the Ballot Activation Mechanism (BAM). The BAM printed on the ballot will allow the voter to proceed to a BMD to mark, review and then cast his/her ballot.

Ballot Marking Device (BMD): The voting machine that voters use to make selections, mark and cast their paper ballot at a voting location. The BMD provides a variety of assistive features including multiple languages and disabilities aids. The BMD does not retain or tally voter selection once the session is complete. Additionally, the BMD ballots do not store any identifying information about the voter.

Hardware: The physical part of election equipment such as the voting devices, scanners and printers which are controlled by the software.

Interactive Sample Ballot (ISB): A digital sample ballot in the form of a responsive website that voters can use to make selections before an election. The ISB creates a Poll Pass that voters can use to scan their pre-marked selections into a BMD to speed up their voting experience in the vote center.

Patent: An exclusive right granted for an invention, which is a product or a process that provides, in general, a new way of doing something or offers a new technical solution to a problem. To get a patent, technical information about the invention must be disclosed to the public in a patent application.

Precinct Ballot Reader (PBR): A component of the current InkaVote Plus system used in precinct polling places to catch over votes and blank ballots on manually marked ballots. The PBR will be made obsolete by the BMD in the new voting system.

Quick Response (QR) Code: A two-dimensional barcode widely used for many purposes. Applications include product tracking, item identification, time tracking, document management and general marketing. The QR code can store up to 4,296 alphanumeric or 7,089 numeric characters, and if a high level of error correction is used, up to 30% of the image can be smudged and still be recognized. Created in the mid-1990s by a Toyota subsidiary to track parts on assembly lines, they are widely used in Japan. The technology became an ISO standard in 2000 and gained popularity in the U.S. within the decade.

Tally System: A system of hardware and software that reads and captures the vote selections on ballots; applies required business rules and adjudications; tabulates the totals of votes, ballots cast, and other metrics; and publishes the results the election. The tally system also supports transparent auditing processes to ensure the accuracy and integrity of the election tally results.

Trademark: A sign capable of distinguishing the goods or services of one enterprise from those of other enterprises. Trademarks are protected by intellectual property rights.

Vote At Polls (VAP): When a voter cast their ballot on election day in-person at a polling place.

Vote By Mail (VBM): The absentee voting option where voters mark the VBM Ballot and then mail it in or drop it off at an authorized location during an election. The RR/CC has an in-house mailing operation that mails out and tallies VBM votes at RR/CC Headquarters. There are roughly 2.2 million permanent vote by mail voters in Los Angeles County and rising.

Vote Center: A polling location that enables any registered voter in the jurisdiction to vote the specific ballot style of that voter at the site. With the use of connected electronic pool books, the voter need not vote provisionally and can choose to vote at the vote center most convenient that day regardless of the location within the County.

Voting Systems Assessment Project (VSAP): The Voting Systems Assessment Project was developed by the Registrar-Recorder/County Clerk (RR/CC) in 2009 to address an aging voting system and an increasingly large and complex electorate. The project seeks a collaborative approach to voting system design that will put voters at the center and maximize stakeholder participation.

Vote By Mail Packet Material

The VBM packet materials include: 1) an outgoing window envelope; 2) a pre-addressed return envelope; 3) a privacy sleeve; 4) a VBM ballot; 5) an instruction or sample ballot booklet; 6) an "I Voted" sticker; and 7) additional inserts that may be required for a specific election.

VSAP GENERAL VOTING SYSTEM PRINCIPLES

1. The voting system must provide for transparency. The processes and transactions associated with how the system is set up, run, and stored should be easy for the public to understand and verify. This should include making hardware components available for inspection, and source code to the extent that the manner of doing so would not jeopardize system security or availability.
2. The voting system must be scalable. The system must provide sufficient technical and physical capacity to accommodate large and complex ballot styles, growing language needs, extremely large numbers of precincts and consolidation of elections with local districts and municipalities.
3. The voting system must be flexible. It must provide the ability to adapt to different election types, environments, and changing regulatory requirements, without the need to replace the entire system or to undertake costly system modifications that potentially compromise security.
4. The voting system must instill public trust by having the ability to produce a physical and tangible record of a voter's ballot to verify the ballot was marked as intended before it is cast and to ensure auditability of the system. It must demonstrate to voters, candidates, and the general public that all votes are counted as cast.
5. The voting system must have integrity and be accountable to voters and follow existing regulations. System features must protect against fraud and tampering. It should also be easy to audit and produce useful, accessible data to verify vote counts and monitor system performance.
6. The voting system must offer a variety of options to cast a vote to ensure that a single/fixed method of voting does not prove to be a barrier and source of disenfranchisement for any group of voters. The system should allow for variety in the location, time, and equipment used to cast a ballot.
7. The voting system must guarantee a private and independent voting experience for all voters, including voters with a full range of types of disabilities and voters with limited English proficiency. Voting system features must allow the voter to select the language, adjust display features, alternate ballot formats (e.g., Audio Ballot), and method of controlling the marking tool, allowing voters to cast a ballot independently.
8. The voting system must be easy for all voters to use, in particular, for voters with a full range of types of disabilities and voters with limited English proficiency. The system must support plain language and be intuitive, user-friendly, and accessible to all, in order to minimize and easily identify voter

errors. It should also provide all voters the ability to easily correct any errors that appear on their ballot prior to casting their ballot.

9. The voting system should be easy and reliable for election workers to use, set-up, breakdown, and explain.
10. The voting system must be portable. It should be lightweight and compact enough for transportation, set up, and efficient storage. A portable system could include features such as hand grips, handles, straps, and wheels that make transporting and maneuvering the voting system easy.
11. The voting system must include features for safe and secure storage. It should include features such as locks and security seals to protect the integrity of the machine while in the custody of election workers or in storage with election officials.
12. The voting system must have minimal and/or flexible power and connectivity requirements. It should not require such an extensive amount of power and connectivity that it limits locations where the voting system can be deployed.
13. The voting system must have minimal requirements for system boot/programming at polling sites and/or vote centers. It must also provide intuitive and quick fix troubleshooting solutions to empower election workers on Election Day. It should be easy to set up for operation by election workers at polling sites and/or vote centers.
14. The voting system must be cost-effective. Costs considered should include procurement, operating, and maintenance costs as well as consideration of expected system/equipment lifespan.

9. The right to ask questions to elections officials about election procedures and watch the election process. If the person you ask cannot answer your questions, they must send you to the right person for an answer. If you are disruptive, they can stop answering you.

10. The right to report any illegal or fraudulent election activity to an elections official or the Secretary of State's office.
