Also on Oct. 6-7, we are supporting a very important Stop Blackwater event in Potrero. including an encampment and educational programs, followed by a rally and gathering at the gate. Protesters are coming from all points to participate. Don't miss this experience of a lifetime! WE NEED YOUR HELP TO ADD TO THE CRITICAL MASS OPPOSING BLACKWATER!

The event will start on Saturday, Oct 6<sup>th</sup> with a hike to the Hauser Canyon conducted by the Sierra Club from 9am-2pm. Then, at the Potrero Regional Park, educational sessions will be held until 5pm. From 7-9, the event moves to the “rally site,” (a ranch only a mile from the valley targeted for destruction by Blackwater) for evening sessions from 7-9, including music and spoken word. Participants may optionally camp or RV at the Potrero Regional campground or use other lodging.

On Sunday, Oct. 7th, the main event will occur at the rally site, gathering at noon. Keynote speakers (TBA) and Congressman Bob Filner (confirmed) will speak. Telephonic connections will be made with similar events at the Blackwater North site in Illinois and the headquarters of Blackwater in North Carolina.

Raymond Lutz did a presentation on Blackwater which was extremely well attended with perhaps 100 people. He'll be repeating the presentation at the upcoming "Stop Blackwater" event, in case you missed it.

**POTRERO PLANNING GROUP**

Although five of the six remaining planning group members are up for recall in the December 11<sup>th</sup> elections and they've reconsidered and approved the proposal by Blackwater USA to build an 824-acre training camp, they continue to attempt to be relevant by having Blackwater representative Brian Bonfiglio answer questions of the public at the Potrero Planning Group meeting on September 13th.

In the last issue of the *East County Progressive*, we reported that Bonfiglio cited a schedule conflict and could not attend our Paramilitary Training Camps Forum due to a prior commitment (although we found out later that he was in town and attempted to sabotage our meeting, suggesting to at least one of our speakers that they not attend the meeting and have a beer with him in Coronado instead.)

Brian confirmed at this meeting that the firm Greystone Ltd, based in Barbados and that deals in interna-

tional mercenary army operations, is indeed a part of the Blackwater family of companies.

The meeting was mostly uneventful, with a few opponents speaking out against a room full of Blackwater supporters.

The GO Team had a training session on September 15<sup>th</sup> and 13 new precinct leaders were trained. **FILM and ECDC MEETING**

On September 16th, we screened the film *Zeitgeist* and a club meeting at the Rancho San Diego Library. We had a fairly healthy attendance, with quite a number of guests who were specifically interested in the film.

Nearly two hours in length, we did not have time to fully complete the video. Most of the positive feedback from the viewers was about the first part of the three-part film which considered the story of Christ and other mythical figures with respect to astronomical facts.

The major components of these myths (miraculous virgin birth on Dec. 25th, star and three wise men, twelve followers or disciples, crucifixion, and resurrection after three days) are not unique to Christianity, but were common to many earlier figures, such as Horus of Egypt, Mithra, Krishna, etc.

It turns out that these elements are actually more likely teaching the major astrological facts. and relate to the worship of our sun. The birth-death-resurrection sequence has to do with the winter solstice and the seasons resulting from the slight tip in the rotational axis of the earth. Ancient man conceptualized this as a battle between day and night. As the sunrise moves further and further south, the days get shorter and finally, on Dec. 22 or so, the sun seems to stop in the sky for three days. This is

located right under the southern crux constellation, the cross. Then, the sun starts to move again, being resurrected.

Thus, the sun is crucified on the cross, is dead for three days, and then is resurrected. The location of the winter solstice sunrise is pointed out by the star Sirius lining up with the three stars of Orion's belt, known as the "Three Kings". Therefore the "Three Kings" followed the star of Sirius to point out the location of the birth of the sun. Of course, they didn't really celebrate the dominion of day over night until the days started to get longer than the nights, the Spring equinox, or "Easter." The twelve followers of Christ the sun, are really just symbols for the twelve constellations of the zodiac.

## COPs NEWS

Citizens' Oversight Projects, AKA "COPs" has been a very successful project so far! As a citizen in a democracy, it's your job to oversee the entire government! Too bad the job not helped by a lack of independent investigative journalists, and a government that is so large, it doesn't even know how big it is.

Instead, we are looking for citizens who can just go to local governmental meetings, usually once or twice a month. Having a citizens in the room changes these meetings from insiders robbing the piggy bank to respectable affairs.

This month, we have a new COP that has joined our ranks. Robin Brailsford has volunteered to follow the Jamul-Dulzura Planning Group and follow the Hwy-94 wid-

ening proposal. Thank you!

In March, the El Cajon City Council appointed a new representative to the Gillespie Field Development Council after John Gibson left the seat. You may know that John Gibson, VP of Hamann Company, has been involved in almost every questionable move by El Cajon in recent years, including the takeover of ECPAC by Christian Community Theater (CCT), the expansion of Shadow Mountain Church, and the use of the key downtown block for a church and Venture Christian high school.

With that said, the appointee was Jeff Hurley, the candidate with obvious conflict of interest in the airport area, and probably the hand-picked replacement by Gibson.

COPs continued to look into this issue and has made multiple requests for public information,

both with the City of El Cajon, and San Diego County. Finally, we discovered that Hurley had never submitted Form 700, the financial disclosure normally required within 30-days of taking office. After we put the pressure on in our last request of the City of El Cajon, Mr. Hurley resigned from his post on Sept. 17th.

El Cajon is starting to learn that you don't mess with the COPs.

Citizens' Oversight also produced a press release that called on the US Congress to pull the funding of Blackwater.
