Mark Hanson (Democrat) and Joe Shea (Libertarian) are running for State Senator, 36th District, against incumbent (Republican). The 36th District covers most of the area in Riverside County.

Mark Hanson, Democrat, believes "Fallbrook is a leader in technology and agricultural solutions to the energy crisis. Of this, Hanson says he would encourage alternative energy (e.g., solar cells) that would produce good jobs and sustainable energy. Moreover, Hanson suggests the "farmlands surrounding Fallbrook as ground for ethanol production." To make Fallbrook more effective, he would "institute apprenticeship and internships to enable students to be prepared for higher education and careers that requires critical thinking upon high school graduation." Hanson says to increase the health and prosperity of Fallbrook, he would have affordable healthcare available that he would also focus on prison reform.

Hanson's qualifications are extensive. He served as a Resource Development for the Grossmont/Cuyamaca Community College District and won awards from the National Council on Education of the California School Boards Association. He founded the International, San Diego, an organization that focuses on productivity, communication and finance. He says that if his companies produce alternative energy, the next energy revolution, which will create over 450,000 jobs.
